The first woman in U.S. history to be elected both a Governor and a United States Senator, New Hampshire's Jeanne Shaheen is a trailblazer with a reputation for working across the aisle to get things done. She has served in the Senate since 2009 and is a member of the Senate Committees on Armed Services, Foreign Relations, Appropriations, Small Business and Entrepreneurship and the Select Committee on Ethics. Recently, following a trip to Afghanistan to meet with local leaders, Senator Shaheen began spearheading the campaign to make sure Women Afghani leaders are at the table for peace talks with the Taliban. The Senator has pressed Sec. Mike Pompeo and the Trump administration and plans to continue to do so until women Afghani leaders are assured a seat at the table. This campaign, along with numerous others, highlight her crucial role as the sole female voice on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, to continue to not only advance women rights domestically, but to also mirror those efforts abroad.

Between her time as Governor and election to the U.S. Senate, Shaheen served as the Director of Harvard University's Institute of Politics at the Kennedy School of Government.

Shaheen was born in Saint Charles, Missouri. Her father worked his way up to a management position in a shoe factory and her mother worked as a secretary in their local church. After attending public schools, Shaheen received a bachelor's degree from Shippensburg University in Pennsylvania and a master's degree from the University of Mississippi. She and her husband, Bill, live in Madbury and have three daughters, Stefany, Stacey and Molly, and seven grandchildren.
